NEW POWERS TO TACKLE HUMAN TRAFFICKING New powers to tackle trafficking suspects have come into force, which means potential victims will be protected from harm. Police can now apply to courts for a Trafficking and Exploitation Risk Order which means the suspect is banned from a range of activity with potential restrictions on movement or on internet use. RESPONDING TO FEMALE GENITAL MUTILATION (FGM) IN SCOTLAND

New multi-agency guidance provides a framework within which agencies and practitioners can develop and agree processes to promote the safety and wellbeing of women and girls. It covers how to identify whether a girl including an unborn girl or young woman may be at risk of FGM; how to identify a girl or woman who has undergone FGM; how to protect those at risk and support

To follow fraud news click here. Last year, victims reported losing nearly £16 million to Christmas shopping fraudsters. Action Fraud's analysis of last year's crimes also shows that 65% of crimes at Christmas were linked to online auctions sites, with

the average loss for these reports coming in at £727. Action Fraud tips: Think before you buy:

- If something seems too much of a bargain, it's probably poor quality, fake or doesn't exist.
- Never click on unsolicited emails or text messages. Criminals can use the technology to make emails or texts look like they come from a legitimate business or organisation.
- If you're **buying tickets**, always buy from official sources and never pay by direct transfer.
- If you're **buying a holiday online**, research it thoroughly to ensure that is a genuine offer and check to make sure it is registered with ABTA and ATOL.
- Use methods like PayPal when buying on auction sites; never transfer money to someone you don't ٠ know.
- Secure Wi-Fi is vital Check that the Wi-fi network you're using is secure before you make any financial transactions.

GUARDIANSHIP ORDERS New figures published by the Mental Welfare Commission show a rise of 12.5% in existing guardianship orders in Scotland, to 12,082 at March 2017. These orders are granted by a court when a person does not have the capacity to make some or all decisions for themselves. 44% of new applications were for people with dementia, and 43% were for people with learning disability. A fifth of all new applications were for people aged between 16 and 24 with learning disability.
