Carer Support

Kenny welcomed Fraser Mitchell and Mhairi Lochhead to the September Forum.

Fraser and Mhairi spoke about their partnership work to re-design the carer assessment process used in Fife. It is anticipated that the form could be used by anyone looking to assess carers' needs in the future. Features of this assessment include:

- An asset based approach
- More focused on how to support the carer in their role
- Done with the person and not to them
- Referring on for additional support
- Identifies outcomes and helps the carer work towards them
- Anyone can use this form it's not just limited to social work or the carers centre
- Used the talking points framework to fit in with existing training

Fraser and Mhairi emphasised that they are continuing to take feedback to improve the form. They are consulting with carers to review the form and ensure it is "fit for purpose".

Carers (Scotland) Bill 2015

Fraser handed out a summary of key points from the Carers (Scotland) Bill 2015 for the Forum. Key points of discussion included:

- National vs local criteria
- Kinship carers (defined as a person who is related to the child (through blood, marriage or civil partnership) or a person with whom the child has a pre-existing relationship).
- Self-Directed Support for carers
- Emergency/future planning

Integration Update

Fiona MacKenzie, Change Manager, Health and Social Care Partnership gave her apologies.

The Shadow Board has not met since the last H&SC Forum on Thursday 06 August 2015. The Integration Scheme is with the Scottish Parliament and will be signed-off in due course. It is the H&SC Partnership who will sign-off the strategic plan (there is no parliamentary sign-off required for this).

The commissioning plan will be part of the strategic plan. It is not yet clear if this will be part of this year's plan.

The Divisional Regional Manager post for West Fife has been advertised. Two more appointments have been made to the board. These are:

- Associate Director of Nursing (Fife Wide) Nicky Connor
- Associate Medical Director Dr. Seonaid McCallum

The group discussed engagement and involvement of the public.



Integrated Care Fund Update

The Integrated Care Fund (ICF) Board will meet on Monday 21 September 2015. It is expected the board will discuss monies set-aside for befriending. 11 organisations have been granted funding for befriending in Fife and have already met to discuss their projects. Discussion themes included:

- Recruitment and retention of staff and volunteers.
- Having a coordinated and joined-up approach Support from the Joint Improvement Team and Evaluation Support Scotland has been approved to assist this process.

Any other competent business

Creative breaks

The Creative Breaks fund is for anyone living in Fife who cares for someone aged 20+ years. Funding has been approved for another year (running from October 2015 to September 2016). Due to the volume of bids, the sum allocated to the project this year is less than last, however the funder has stipulated that the maximum grant should be £300 (rather than the £500 of previous years) so that a similar volume of recipients may be supported.

Strengthening Communities Partnership

The Strengthening Communities Partnership has not yet met. Kenny Murphy is a member of this group.

Community Learning & Development Plan 2015-2018

Kenny distributed a copy of the new 'Community Learning & Development Plan 2015-2018' to the Forum. This is the new Community Learning & Development (CLD) strategy for the next three years in Fife. An action plan will also be produced.

Fairer Fife Commissioning

This commission is looking at how to do things differently and what assets are available to support this. The commission is to meet with the Third Sector Strategy Group (TSSG).

Community Empowerment Scotland Act (latest draft)

Key features of the act include:

- H&SC partnerships will be Community Planning Partners by law making them accountable to the public and partners.
- As a Community Planning Partner (public bodies) will have duty to attend Community Planning Partnerships (CPPs)
- A duty to engage
- Community groups can request a transfer of asset (building or service) and the Local Authority must consider this. There is no duty to accept but it must be considered.

A multi-agency group is working in Fife on community rights to buy to ensure that communities have support to achieve this.

Creating a Fairer Scotland

The Scottish Government is inviting members of the public to have their say on what a Fairer Scotland should look like in 2030, and how to make this vision a reality.

The currently nearest planned event is in Dundee on Thursday 05 November.

John Stirling – Disabilities Fife held their AGM on Wednesday 09 September at New Volunteer House.


Aiveen Ryan:
