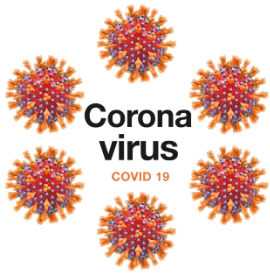

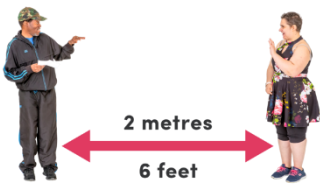

What is the research about?



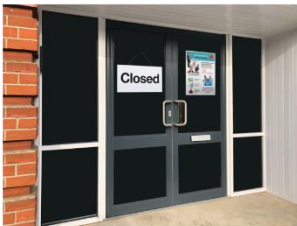
Coronavirus is a new illness. It is changing the way we live.
