FVAWP – Domestic Abuse What You Need to Know (SW3709)

AIM:

The aim of this is course is for participants to develop a greater awareness and understanding of the nature of domestic abuse, its impact and consequences.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of the course participants will be able -

- To understand domestic abuse as a complex pattern of abusive behaviours
- To understand the difficulties faced by victims leaving an abusive relationship
- Know how to give appropriate and effective support

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

It is suitable for practitioners who work with children, young people, vulnerable people, victims/survivors of abuse and perpetrators and is particularly suitable for new staff, students and as part of induction training.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

This course is aimed at practitioners working across services who would benefit from a knowledge of the dynamics, impact and consequences of domestic abuse.

DOMESTIC ABUSE AND PROTECTION OF CHILDREN



FVAWP - Domestic Abuse and Protection of Children (SW4470)

AIM:

The aim of this is course is for participants to develop an understanding of the nature and scope of domestic abuse, its impact, consequences and its intersections with child safety, wellbeing and protection.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of the training participants will have:

- an understanding of the dynamics and impact of domestic abuse on mothers and children;
- an awareness of the links between domestic abuse, child welfare and protection;
- a basic understanding of the Safe and Together approach to domestic abuse.

WHO SHOULD AT TEND?

It is suitable for those working with children, young people, adult victims/ survivors of abuse and perpetrators.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

This course is aimed at practitioners working with families who are experiencing domestic abuse.

Participants explore the complexities of domestic abuse and steps involved in keeping children and young people safe from harm; recognising the impact of perpetrators coercive behaviour on adult and child victims. Participants are briefly introduced to the Safe & Together approach, which focuses on harm to children, supporting the non-abusing parent and holding the perpetrator to account. It is designed to support and enhance practice alongside existing child protection guidelines and GIRFEC obligations.

THE IMPACT OF DOMESTIC ABUSE IN THE EARLY YEARS

The Impact of Domestic Abuse in the Early Years (SW3477)

AIM:

The aim of this session is to allow participants to better understand the dynamics of domestic abuse and the impact this has on mothers, babies and toddlers highlighting the links between domestic abuse, GIRFEC and practitioners child protection responsibilities.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of the training participants will:

- Have an understanding of the dynamics and impact of domestic abuse on mothers, babies and toddlers
- Be able to identify indicators of domestic abuse
- Understand the links between domestic abuse and attachment
- Make explicit links between domestic abuse and the GIRFEC Framework

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

It is particularly suitable for Early Years Nursery and Playgroup Staff, Early Years Officers, Health Visitors, Child Minders, Social Work and Third Sector staff.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

This 1 day seminar is aimed at practitioners working in the early years setting or supporting mothers with children under the age of 4 years.

Children who live in households where domestic abuse occurs can suffer physical, psychological and emotional harm through directly or indirectly experiencing domestic abuse. This course will make explicit how domestic abuse is a child protection issue.

UNDER PRESSURE (ZERO TOLERANCE RESOURCE)



FVAWP Under Pressure (Zero Tolerance resource) (SW5126a)

AIM:

The aim of this is course is for participants to develop an understanding of the nature and scope of domestic abuse, its impact, consequences and its intersections with child safety, wellbeing and protection.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

To better increase knowledge, skills and confidence in the delivery of effective sexualisation awareness, abuse prevention and early intervention strategies in your work with young people.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

It is suitable for staff who would like to use the Under Pressure training programme.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

This course aims to increase the skills and awareness around abuse and exploitation in young people's intimate relationships, as well as providing activity resources for those frontline staff to use with young people to help work towards preventing VAWG (violence against women and girls) by raising awareness of VAWG, changing attitudes towards it, and examining ideas to do with gender inequality.

FEMALE GENITAL MUTILATION (FGM) SEMINAR

FVAWP - Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) Seminar (SW2833)

AIM:

The aim of this session is to allow participants to better understand the dynamics of domestic abuse and the impact this has on mothers, babies and toddlers highlighting the links between domestic abuse, GIRFEC and practitioners child protection responsibilities.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of the training participants will:

- To understand the practice and consequences of female genital mutilation/female circumcision
- To better understand the prevalence, reasons and justifications for this practice
- To develop an understanding of how to identify those at potential risk of FGM
- To be able to access appropriate support and information for clients and professionals
- To gain an understanding of the legal issues around FGM

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

It is suitable for professionals working across all services.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

Female Genital Mutilation is an abuse of human rights and is a child protection issue. This stand-alone, multi-agency seminar is aimed at professionals working across services to raise awareness of the very current issue surrounding female genital mutilation, including prevalence, consequences, legal aspects and implications for practice. There is a need for us all to become more aware of FGM which is widespread in a number of communities in Scotland.

MARAC MULTI-AGENCY RISK ASSESSMENT CONFERENCING



MARAC (Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conferencing) Domestic Abuse and the Safety of High Risk Victims (SW3507)

AIM:

This seminar will provide key information about the MARAC process including information on: Talking about domestic abuse with victims, risk assessment and safety planning, making a referral to the MARAC process, information sharing and the MARAC meeting and MARAC Risk Management Plans.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Participants will:

- Develop a robust understanding of the dynamics of domestic abuse
- Understand the impact of domestic abuse on the lives of victims, including children
- Have an increased awareness of risks associated with very high risk cases of domestic abuse and the value of a robust risk assessment tool
- Understand how the MARAC process can enhance the protection of victims including children living with domestic abuse
- Understand the MARAC process in Fife and the practitioner's role within it.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

The MARAC process allows agencies to share information about very high risk cases of domestic abuse and together agree a Risk Management Plan (RMP). Whatever service/ organisation you work in, you will be in contact with victims of domestic abuse. Victims need frontline staff to have an excellent understanding of risk in relation to domestic abuse. Through the sharing of information and expertise, the MARAC process enhances the safety of the individuals at highest risk of further abuse.

RAPE & SEXUAL ASSAULT WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

FVAWP - Rape & Sexual Assault What You Need to Know (SW2987)

AIM:

To develop an understanding of the specific issues for those who have been raped or sexually assaulted at some time in their lives.

Objectives of the training:

- To consider the nature, attitude and prevalence of sexual abuse
- To examine the immediate and longer term impacts
- To identify ways to deal with disclosure
- To become familiar with police and court procedures

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

On completing this training participants will:

- Have an increased understanding of the complexities surrounding those who have experienced rape or sexual abuse
- Recognise the difficulties for those disclosing or reporting rape or sexual abuse
- Know how to cope with disclosure of rape or sexual abuse
- Be aware of the importance of good practice in the work place
- Appreciate the roles of other agencies and inter-agency working

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

This one day course is facilitated by Fife Rape and Sexual Assault Centre (FRASAC) and is aimed at practitioners working with adults and/or children or who those who are supporting survivors of sexual abuse.

SEE ME NOT MY MASK UNDERSTANDING INDIVIDUALS REACTIONS TO SEXUAL TRAUMA



FVAWP - See me not my mask:

Understanding Individuals Reactions to Sexual Trauma (SW2705)

AIM:

To support participants gain an increased understanding around the complexities of disclosure and in particular how those affected may react or respond. This generic training is aimed at support workers and other professionals who may facilitate disclosure and/or reporting and recording of sexual trauma.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of the training participants will have:

- Increased understanding of the complexities surrounding those who have experienced sexual trauma
- Be able to recognise the difficulties for those disclosing or reporting sexual trauma and how that will be presented
- Increased understanding of the importance of the listener/helper role when working with sexual trauma.
- Increased skills and understanding in responding to individual disclosure.
- Increased knowledge and understanding of good practice.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

This full day course is facilitated by Lynn Simpson and Lorraine Cafferkey, Kingdom Abuse Survivors Project. Kingdom Abuse Survivors Project exists to provide support which aims to eliminate the debilitating effects that childhood sexual abuse can have on adult survivors. The course is aimed at those who are already working in an area where contact with survivors where sexual trauma is common.

UNDERSTANDING MEN AND BOYS EXPERIENCES OF RAPE AND SEXUAL ABUSE (FRASAC AND KASP)

Understanding Men And Boys Experiences Of Rape And Sexual Abuse (FRASAC and KASP)

AIM:

- To develop an understanding of the specific issues for men and boys who have experienced abuse.
- To look at what may be unique to being a male survivor, examine the barriers to disclosure and challenge myths and assumptions.
- To identify ways we as workers can support male survivors.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

On completing this training participants will:

- Have an increased understanding of the difficulties male survivors face.
- Recognise the difficulties around disclosure or reporting
- Know how best to cope with disclosure and the subsequent challenges that may arise for you as a worker as a result.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

It is suitable for a those who are already working in an area where contact with male survivors of domestic abuse is common. The training will look at men and boys experience of surviving rape and sexual assault.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

This full day course is facilitated by Fife Rape & Sexual Assault Centre (FRASAC) and Kingdom Abuse Survivors Project (KASP) and is aimed at those who are already working in an area where contact with survivors of abuse is common. The training will look at men and boys experience of surviving childhood sexual abuse, rape & sexual assault and how they can often be the hidden victims.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND EXPLOITATION IN SCOTLAND: WHAT FRONTLINE SERVICE WORKERS NEED TO KNOW

Human Trafficking and Exploitation in Scotland: What Frontline Service Workers Need to Know

AIM:

 Participants will learn about human trafficking and exploitation, its prevalence in Scotland, and what supports are available.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Participants will learn:

- Some of the major indicators of human trafficking
- The links between commercial sexual exploitation and trafficking
- Some of the challenges to disclosure
- How to best help potential victims and how to access services available

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Frontline services including women's organisations, and those working with vulnerable adults such as migrants, women in prostitution, the homeless.

COURSE DESCRIPTOR:

This course is run by Trafficking Awareness Raising Alliance, one of Scotland's leading support agencies for women who have been trafficked for the purposes of commercial sexual exploitation. The course is aimed towards services who may come into contact with adults who are potential victims of trafficking. Different forms of trafficking will be covered, but the primary focus will be around adults trafficked for commercial sexual exploitation.
