Living Wage Week is the annual celebration of the Living Wage movement and will take place 14-20th November 2022.

This year, with prices rising at their highest rate in decades, the real Living Wage is more important than ever. LIVING WAGE: THE BASICS



The Living Wage campaign is an independent movement of businesses, organisations and people who believe a hard day's work deserves a fair day's pay. Employers choose to pay the real Living Wage on a voluntary basis - it provides an ethical benchmark for responsible pay.

The campaign for a Living Wage was launched by members of London Citizens in 2001. Parents in East London found that despite working on two or more minimum wage jobs they were struggling to make ends meet, and were left with no time for community and family life. It is an example of how civil society, businesses and organisations can work together to tackle in-work poverty. It enjoys cross party support with public backing from successive Metropolitan Mayors and MPs across the UK, including First Ministers in Wales and Scotland.

What is the real Living Wage?

The real Living Wage is currently £10.90 (UK) and £11.95 (London). The real Living Wage rates are independently calculated by economists at the Resolution Foundation and overseen by the Living Wage Commission. Find out more here.

Know the difference

- The real Living Wage is independently calculated based on what employees and their families need to live. It's higher than the government's minimum wage, rebranded as the National Living Wage for over 23s.
- Employers voluntarily choose to pay it changing people's lives right now.
- It applies to all workers over 18 recognising that young people have the same living costs as everyone else.

Achievements of our movement

- The campaign for a real Living Wage has now <u>delivered more than £2billion</u> in extra wages to workers since it began in 2001.
- The movement has lifted almost 400,000 people out of in-work poverty. With over 11,000 accredited Living Wage Employers.

The Living Wage isn't just good for workers, it's good for business too.

- 93% of university graduates want to work for a Living Wage Employer
- Over 90% of the Living Wage network say it has benefitted their business in some way
- 90% of consumers agree that pay should reflect living costs
- 60% had increased motivation and commitment from Living Wage employees
- 86% of Living Wage Employers said it has enhanced their reputation as an employer

THE THEME THIS YEAR:



A REAL LIVING WAGE IS "MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER"

Everyone has been affected by the rising cost of living this year, but no one more than the 4.8 million workers earning below the real Living Wage. Millions of low-paid workers and their families are really feeling the pain of the rising bills right now and our Living Wage movement is at the heart of the solutions to this crisis.

The real Living Wage remains the only wage rate calculated based on the living costs and, with the cost of living rising, earning a real Living Wage has never been more important. Accredited Living Wage Employers, like yourselves, provide staff with security and a long-term commitment to a wage that always meets the cost of living every year.

We thank you for your continued commitment and look forward to celebrating all Living Wage Employers during Living Wage Week.

Team coffee morning



GETTING THE PUBLIC'S ATTENTION

Using spaces to highlight you pay the real Living Wage proves extremely effective. Below are some examples of what employers have done in the past to raise awareness of the real Living Wage.



Use the pavements!

Norwich City Council sprayed their pavements with Living Wage messages, like above. What a great way to get people's attention on the way to work.



Use what you've got...

National Express branded one of their buses in the West Midlands with a Living Wage logo for Living Wage Week (Above).

Whereas London Stadium put up some branded messages on their digital screen.





Put up some posters

In the past, the Mayor of London has secured posters across the London Underground during Living Wage Week. Clear Channel and Creature of London ran a joint campaign across UK billboards and digital advertising space.



Fly the Living Wage flag

Order a flag from us to fly on iconic buildings. In the past Cardiff Castle put up 40 Living Wage flags, and many other council buildings have done the same - shout out to Hackney and Southwark Council.
