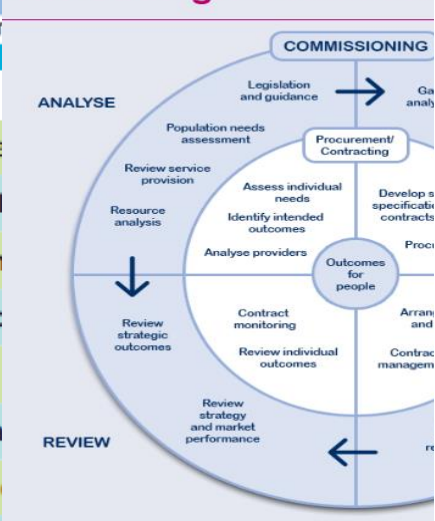

## The Strategic Commissioning Cycle

  - 6 People who provide health and social care services are able to work in a safe and healthy environment
  - 7 People who use health services are able to live in a safe and healthy environment
  - 8 People who work in health and social care are able to work in a safe and healthy environment
  - 9 Resources are used efficiently and effectively
