The Job

The purpose of the job is to deliver an exciting new project which is supported by the Scottish Government's Survivor Support Innovation and Development Fund. 'Better than Well' will support adult survivors of childhood trauma in Fife, particularly those who have found it difficult to engage with other services and will be open to all adult survivors, but there will be an additional effort to engage with survivors who have experienced homelessness.

Working closely with the Service Delivery Manager, the Team Leader will ensure the achievement of high-quality services for people who have experienced childhood trauma to manage any resulting impact and focus on their safety and stabilisation.

The Team Leader will provide day to day management, leadership, support and supervision to a team of staff.

Leading by example, the Team Leader will ensure that objectives and targets are met and the service meets all internal and external standards and reporting requirements. The Team Leader's role includes an externally facing remit to develop relationships with other partners and services whilst actively promoting opportunities for the services to work together to deliver improved outcomes for those we provide services for.

The Team Leader will work together with the team and Service Delivery Manager to facilitate training sessions and shared learning events with our range of external partners. The Team Leader will be responsible for ensuring outcomes are recorded and reported in line with funder requirements.

You will need:

- Educated to diploma level (or equivalent) with experience of approaches to self-help techniques and/or CBT approach
- Knowledge of issues affecting people who are excluded and marginalized
- To be able to lead, manage and motivate team through regular planned meeting and support
- Demonstrable experience of using a person-centred approach
- A knowledge of mental health self-help resources and a commitment to their use
 - Good communication skills in a variety of situations
- Meet the requirements of registration with Protection of Vulnerable Groups Scheme check
