

Last quarter our teams achieved some great success across Fife, Scottish Borders, East and Midlothian:

- We moved over 120 participants into employment
- We are providing in-work support to over 240 participants
- We are currently supporting approximately 540 participants



About in-work support

From managing their money to adjusting to their working life routines, we provide participants with in-work help and advice for up to 52 weeks, between 8am – 8pm Monday – Friday.
